338.1. COMPENSATED PROFESSIONAL LEAVES	
1. Purpose	This policy shall establish the district's exclusive parameters for granting professional development and classroom occupational exchange leaves for certificated administrative and professional employees.
2. Definitions SC 1166.1	Professional Development Leave - shall be defined as a leave of absence granted for the purpose of improving professional competency or obtaining a professional certificate or commission. Such leave shall be directly related to an employee's professional responsibilities, as determined by the Board, and be restricted to activities required by state regulation or law.
SC 522.2	Classroom Occupational Exchange Leave - shall be defined as a leave of absence granted for the purpose of acquiring practical work experience in business, industry or government.
3. Authority SC 1166.1	The Board shall have sole authority to adopt and enforce policy establishing the conditions for approval of a professional development leave. All requests for such leave shall be subject to review by the Board. The Board may approve or reject a proposed plan for professional development leave under the process of this policy exclusively. The primary objective of a compensated leave program is to enable qualified individuals to engage in professional activities that will contribute significantly to the background and skill of the staff members and result in substantial benefits to the district. This analysis shall include scrutiny of the proposed programs and institutions selected by the applicant.
SC 522.2	The Board may grant a leave to eligible employees for classroom occupational exchange leave for the specified purpose as defined in this policy.

Guidelines</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT LEAVE</p> <p><u>Eligibility</u></p> <p>SC 1166 To qualify for professional development leave, an eligible employee shall have completed ten (10) years of satisfactory service in the public schools of the Commonwealth; at least five (5) consecutive years of such service shall be in this school district.</p> <p>SC 1166 A leave for professional development may be taken for a half or full school term or for two (2) half school terms during a period of two (2) years, at the employee's option.</p> <p>SC 1167 The number of professional development leaves of absence granted in any school year shall be limited to ten percent (10%) of the number of persons eligible for such leaves of absence regularly employed in the district. A leave granted for one (1) semester only shall be counted as one (1) leave in determining the ten percent (10%) limit. Decimal fractions shall be rounded up.</p> <p><u>Application</u></p> <p>SC 1166.1 Professional development leaves shall be granted only to employees participating in an academic program for the purpose of retaining a professional certificate or commission, further preparation and improvement in an area(s) of certification, additional certification, attaining other appropriate and identifiable educational positions within the school district, or as the Board may require, and upon the recommendation of the Superintendent.</p> <p>Requests for professional development leave shall be submitted on the district form and forwarded with a detailed plan to the Superintendent.</p> <p>Applications for professional development shall be given preference according to the length of time since the last professional development leave was taken, provided all other requirements are met.</p> <p>All required application materials must be received in the Superintendent's office by the fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) working day in January of the school year preceding the school year of the requested occupational exchange leave. All requests will be submitted at the February Board meeting.</p>
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	<p><u>Documentation</u></p> <p>SC 1166.1 Applicants for professional development leave shall submit with the application form a detailed plan describing the professional development activities to be undertaken and a statement specifying the benefits of the leave to the employee and the school district. The plan shall provide sufficient information to permit the Board to adequately evaluate the request based on the standards for approval set forth in this policy.</p> <p>SC 1171 The Board may at any time require additional information from the employee in order to assist the Board in determining whether the leave is being used for the purpose for which it was granted.</p> <p>SC 1166.1 The minimum requirements for leave for a half school term shall consist of any one or a combination of the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Nine (9) graduate credits.</li> <li>2. Twelve (12) undergraduate credits.</li> <li>3. One hundred eighty (180) hours of professional development activities.</li> </ol> <p>SC 1166.1 The minimum requirements for leave for a full school term shall consist of any one or a combination of the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Eighteen (18) graduate credits.</li> <li>2. Twenty-four (24) undergraduate credits.</li> <li>3. Three hundred sixty (360) hours of professional development activities.</li> </ol> <p>SC 1166.1, 1171 Applicants who propose to take graduate or undergraduate credits shall submit notification of acceptance and enrollment from an accredited institution of higher learning for study in courses approved by the Superintendent. The courses connected with the credits proposed by the applicant must possess onsite or online interactive instruction and must be accorded full undergraduate or graduate credit from the sponsoring college or university. The employee shall successfully complete the approved courses and receive passing grades. Upon return from professional development leave the employee shall submit to the Superintendent within the first month an official transcript of all courses completed. Failure to receive passing grades or to submit required transcripts on time shall rest in forfeiture of monies paid by the district.</p>
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SC 1166.1, 1171	<p>Applicants who propose to undertake professional development activities shall submit to the Board a detailed plan listing the specific activities. Upon return from professional development leave the employee shall submit to the Superintendent within the first month a formal report describing the educational activities pursued and their benefits and relevancy. Failure to submit required reports on time shall result in forfeiture of monies paid by the district.</p>
SC 1166.1, 1168	<p><u>Commitment Of Employee</u></p> <p>Acceptance of professional development leave incurs a commitment by the employee to return to active duty in this district immediately following the leave for one (1) full school term, unless prevented by illness or physical disability.</p> <p>Employees shall submit required reports on time or forfeit all compensation and benefits.</p>
SC 1168	<p><u>Commitment Of Employer</u></p> <p>At the expiration of the professional development leave, the employee shall be reinstated in the same position held at the time of the granting of the leave.</p>
SC 522.1, 1170	<p>Time on professional development leave shall be counted as time on the job for purposes of seniority and for retirement fund purposes, but for no other purpose.</p> <p><u>Compensation</u></p>
SC 1169	<p>During the period of professional development leave, an employee shall be compensated at least one-half the salary to which s/he would have been entitled had the employee not taken leave.</p> <p>While on leave, the employee shall be entitled to insurance benefits provided other employees of a similar classification.</p>
SC 1166	<p>A leave of absence granted for professional development shall also serve as a leave of absence without pay from all other school activities.</p> <p>Compensable employment may not be engaged in while the employee is on professional development leave.</p>

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CLASSROOM OCCUPATIONAL EXCHANGE LEAVE	
	<p><u>Application</u></p> <p>Requests for classroom occupational exchange leave shall be submitted on the approved district form and forwarded with appropriate documentation to the Superintendent.</p> <p>All required application materials must be received in the Superintendent's office by the fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) working day in January of the school year preceding the school year of the requested occupational exchange leave.</p>
	<p><u>Documentation</u></p> <p>Applicants for classroom occupational exchange leave shall submit with the application form a statement from the employer agreeing to the terms and conditions of the leave, as specified in Board policy.</p>
SC 522.2, 1166.1, 1171	<p>Upon return from such leave, the employee shall submit to the Board a final report detailing the work experience and its benefits.</p>
	<p><u>Commitment Of Employee</u></p>
SC 1168	<p>Acceptance of classroom occupational exchange leave incurs a commitment by the employee to return to active duty in this district immediately following the leave for one (1) full school term, unless prevented by illness or physical disability.</p>
	<p><u>Commitment Of Employer</u></p>
SC 1168	<p>At the expiration of the classroom occupational exchange leave, the employee shall be reinstated in the same position held at the time of the granting of the leave.</p>
SC 522.2	<p>Time on classroom occupational exchange leave shall be counted as time on the job for purposes of seniority and for retirement fund purposes, but for no other purpose.</p>
	<p><u>Compensation</u></p>
SC 522.2	<p>The business, industry or government to whom the employee is assigned during the leave shall fully compensate the school district for all salary, wages, pension and retirement contributions, and other benefits as if the employee were in full-time active service.</p>
